The Olympic and Paralympic Games

The Olympic Games started in Ancient Greece as a sporting competition between different City States. After several hundred years they ceased and only a record of them survived. The games included running, jumping, discus and boxing and the only prize was a laurel wreath and the glory attached to the individual and his city.


Athens held the first modern Olympic Games in 1896 and again in 2004



Due to the inspiration of Baron de Coubertin an International Olympic Committee (IOC) was established in 1894. After two years of consultation the first Modern Olympic Games were held in Athens in 1896. As in ancient Greece, every four years, cities across the world would compete for the honour of holding the Games. The IOC is still the governing body of the Olympic Games. After World War II, the Winter Olympics were begun and these now take place every two years after the Summer Olympics.

Baron de Coubertin is rightly acclaimed as the Father of the Modern Olympics.



The 2012 Summer Olympics

Great Britain and many other countries will be issuing stamps to commemorate the 2012 Olympics in London. The Olympic Games will have been held in London on three different occasions. It is the only city to have had such an honour.

In 1908 no special stamps were issued to commemorate the games.

In 1948 Great Britain issued a set of four stamps to commemorate the games.




Team Games











The Winter Olympic Games


